Roscrea Stands UP

Derek Russell lives in Glencarrick, Roscrea and was the person who inspired Roscrea Stands Up.

He was the instigator of a public meeting called for the Abbey Hall on 21st July, 2014. It was hoped that forty or fifty people would attend the meeting to discuss issues that were worrying the people of Roscrea: the high unemployment rate; misuse of alcohol; mental health; the lack of facilities for children and teenagers; suicide and the drugs problem in the town.

An estimated seven hundred people actually turned up for the meeting. Expressing anger, concern and worry, issues were discussed and it was agreed to hold a second meeting the following Monday.

Towards the close of the meeting someone suggested that everyone attending should march to the Garda Station on Main St., to protest at the absence of any Garda representation at the meeting. The duty sergeant confirmed that the Gardai would be represented at the following meeting. Roscrea Stands Up was born.

The media were in attendance at the meeting on 28th July as well as an estimated 1400 people. RTE transmitted live from Roscrea on their nine o'clock news, giving Roscrea national prominence. At this meeting five working groups were set up - drugs and alcohol; business and training; housing and environment; youth action and mental health. The groups were tasked with making life for the people of Roscrea better.



At present these groups are working with established groups in the town trying to deliver services to Roscrea. A Board and committee have been selected from the working groups and five public meetings have been held so far, with many more envisaged during the coming months.

Roscrea Stands Up thanks everyone for their help and support since its establishment.

Fr Tom Corbett PP Emeritus

50 Years of Priesthood, 1964-2014

Tom Corbett was born in Scariff, Co. Clare on the 19th January, 1939. He grew up in a farming and hard working environment and enjoyed the pleasures of a simple lifestyle and lovely close neighbourliness. Education brought new insights and differing experiences. He was ordained as a priest in Maynooth in 1964 and has spent his life as priest of Killaloe. He taught briefly in St. Flannan's College and was Director of Religious Education in the diocese. Subsequently he was appointed to the Pontifical University at St. Patrick's College Maynooth. There he spent thirty three great years as teacher of theology and became Chairperson of The Irish Theological Association and Dean of the Faculty. He also delighted in his time to assist in parishes in Florida, helping parishes which had a great debt to many Irish priests and prepared him to be a priest in a parish, so different a life from the academic world. He is happy to have won a captain's prize in golf in that Maynooth time. Life moved on and he is thankful for he found life in the Silvermines and Roscrea as so fulfilling and so busy that he is glad to have had the great luck to be here tonight. Kennedy Park Celebrates its 50th

Kennedy Park, established in 1964, was named after the late Irish-American President, JFK, and so celebrated its 50th anniversary in June of this year. It has grown in the 50 years to become the biggest housing estate in North Tipperary with 200 houses. It incorporates three estates: Kennedy Park, Brophy Terrace and Cois Carrig. The Residents' Committee was formed in the 1980s. Over the years it has achieved much, none of which would be possible without the community spirit of the residents and the overwhelming pride that they have in this big hearted estate. One of the main aims of the Residents' Association is to provide a safe, friendly and peaceful place for both young and older residents to live and to be proud of. Some of the main events this year were the installation of a defibrillator that is now in permanent place in the estate, the removal of the 'green trees' and the 50th birthday celebrations.

The Association aims to try to provide a much needed play park for the children and the older residents. As the hard-working secretary, Pauline Simmons says: *We like to get them involved so that they are not left feeling lonely or isolated.*

Roscrea Men's Shed is a dedicated, friendly and welcoming meeting place where men come together and undertake a variety of mutually agreed activities. Roscrea Men's Shed is open to all men regardless of age, background or ability. It is a place where you can share your skills and knowledge with others, learn new skills and develop new skills.

New members are always welcome and can be assured that there is something of interest to everyone as the men have ownership of the projects and decide their own programme of events.

“Men don't talk face to face; they talk shoulder to shoulder” was first said by Professor Barry Golding of the University of Ballarat, Victoria and Patron of the Australian Men's Sheds Association. It is often this simple insight that resonates most with people when they first hear about Men's Sheds and are wondering why they work.

The Roscrea Men's Shed was set up in 2013 and aims to help its members improve and maintain their health and well-being by participating in a community Men's Shed. The Shed was originally located at the NTL building and then moved to the Courthouse on Gaol Road. It is open Monday to Friday.

The projects undertaken to date include furniture restoration, flat pack assembly, gardening and making various woodwork projects such as wheelbarrows, window boxes and bird tables. We also get involved in the St. Patrick's parade and A Taste of Roscrea. The Shed is supported by many individuals, groups and businesses to whom we are most grateful for this support.

The Roscrea Men's Shed is also on facebook and our profile is regularly updated with our projects and news items.

In 2013 Joe Coughlan with the help of Sharon Mulrooney and Joe Moloughney set up the Face book page Roscrea Through The Ages. The idea behind this was to try and bring the history and folklore of Roscrea to the younger generation. It started off with a few old photos and stories and in a short space of time it had over one thousand followers. Some of the most popular stories that were posted were, the Executions in the castle yard during the civil war, the story of Daisy Bates and the story of the ninety young orphans sent from the workhouse in Roscrea to Australia. Today the Face book page is getting on average seven thousand hits per week.

In 2014 with the help of Roscrea Credit Union and Dick Conroy, Roscrea Through The Ages website was set up. The idea behind this was that there would be a more permanent record of this material so that students of Roscrea's history in the future may access this. The site is now being read by our Diaspora all over the world and they are now beginning to send back the stories of their ancestors who emigrated in the past. With the help of and thanks to George Cunningham some Roscrea People publications are on the site and it is hoped to have a lot more as they become available.

She played the harp with her family at a concert in Castlecomer church this year which raised €12000 for cancer.

In 2013 at the Waltons Music for Schools Competition in the National Concert Hall, Cliona played the piano, flute and sang with Gaelscoil tSlí Dala where they won 2nd prize.

At the Galway Mummerys Festival she won best singer in the Juvenile competition.

However it has been an exceptional year and hopefully we can build on this experience to challenge in the intermediate grade next year.

Coláiste Phobal Hurling Team, All- Ireland Champions

Coláiste Phobal Ros Cré won the last ever Munster Vocational Schools senior hurling title in March of 2013 and although subsequently beaten in the All-Ireland semi-final by Rathdowney the experience garnered by the players was invaluable. In 2014, after an early upset in the group stages at the hands of St. Mary's, Newport, qualification for the knockout stages was secured with a good win over St. Josephs, Borrisoleigh.

We defeated St. Anne's, Killaloe in the quarter-final with Jordan Fogarty giving a man of the match display. In the Munster semi-final we once again faced St. Mary's, Newport at the all-weather pitch in University of Limerick. A tight low scoring game saw Roscrea get the victory on a score line of 1-9 to 2-3.

On to our first Munster colleges final facing Cashel C.S with a nice sprinkling of Tipperary minors, could we do it? The decisive score was created by Roscrea when Adrian Cleary fielded a high delivery and found Cian Rigney on the edge of the square who shook the twine with a low hard shot. Jordan Fogarty sealed the victory with two superb late points. Munster B Colleges Champions – and on to All-Ireland semi-final against St. Mary's, Galway. Patience eventually paid off and this was another day when the strength of the panel was evident as Adrian Cleary came off the bench to score 1-2. Victory was sealed and we were now in the All-Ireland B Colleges final.

5th April Nowlan Park 3.15 p.m. - Coláiste Phobal Ros Cré –v- Cross and Passion, Ballycastle.

After many close calls in All-Ireland Vocational Finals, this day proved to be the greatest ever for Coláiste Phobal hurling. This was to be Roscrea's day with players just upping their game all over the field and outscored Cross and Passion by 1-9 to 0-4 during that second half. Our outstanding captain graciously received The Paddy Buggy Cup – being presented for the very first time by the Buggy family. Jordan Fogarty collected a deserved Man of the Match award after an awesome

display of hurling. There were scenes of great joy and celebration for all Coláiste Phobal Ros Cré supporters, parents, families, clubs and friends.

Roscrea People Book Donations
