In August 1917, during the First World War, a platoon of Irish Guards, under Sergeant Moyney, were cut off from their battalion on the wrong side of the River Broenbeek in Flanders. A German machine-gun post had been set up between them and the river and at dawn on the sixteenth, a German infantry company, wearing body armour, was sent forward to wipe them out—
